PRESIDENT'S REPORT


It's my pleasure to present this annual report for the 2019 year on behalf of the Board of Wyndham Community & Education Centre Incorporated.

TREASURER'S REPORT


When I reflect on another year where I have had the privilege to serve as the Treasurer at Wyndham Community and Education Centre, I am always gratified and encouraged by the many positive outcomes that are achieved by our students and program participants, as they experience the devoted service and expertise offered by our staff and volunteers. All that are involved in these collaborative and nurturing programs, make a combined contribution that delivers such a profound benefit to the many communities that make up our rapidly expanding Wyndham area, as well as the neighbouring areas where we are also funded to deliver services.

In 2019, our revenues were up from \$8.1M to \$9.4M as we continued to attract funding to deliver a wide variety of services, and while working hard to maintain effective operation of our programs, we managed to record a surplus of \$53,990. With our audited financial reports showing Total Assets of \$12.03M, Total Liabilities of \$7.35M and Total Equity of \$4.67M, the organisation has maintained a sound financial position.

As Wyndham CEC faces the challenges of 2020 and beyond, I am confident that we will continue to refine our service delivery and manage our assets in a manner that represents the prudent and diligent stewardship of our resources.

My thanks and appreciation go to our senior management team, and in particular our CFO, who as Treasurer, I work with closely. I extend that same thanks to managers and all of our staff and volunteers for their efforts. Along with the other members of our Board of Governance, I look forward to a future where Wyndham CEC continues to be a blessing to all we serve and partner with.
