The main international human rights treaty on children's rights is the <u>Convention on the Rights of the Child (CRC)</u>, which Australia ratified in December 1990.

The four Guiding Principles of the CRC are:

- respect for the best interests of the child as a primary consideration
- the right to survival and development

 the right of all children to express their views freely on all matters affecting them

• the right of all children to enjoy all the rights of the CRC without discrimination of any kind.

"This message is coming to you from Toorabul country in Queensland. Last week was Naidoc, and as you know, the theme was "Always Was. Always Will Be." What does this have to do with keeping children safe? Absolutely everything. Land and culture are the keystones of identity for our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children and young people. Identity, its expression and its practice are the foundation on which kids safety, and importantly their self esteem, can be scaffolded.

What's the message? BE CURIOUS. Inquire about a child's identity and what's imp[ortant to them. Show them that you value it"
